WIOA YOUTH PROGRAM

Eligibility Requirements and Verifiable Documents

Before enrollment, eligibility criteria must be met and documented.

- A photocopy of each source of documentation must be retained in the participant’s file.
- Applicant Statements are not to be used as the primary method of verification. Applicant Statements should only be used when the preferred options of documentation or third-party corroboration are not available.
