Dear Board:

We received notification via letter sent July 26, 2016 that the above-named inmate is being considered for early parole release after serving 50% of his sentence. We object because he is unsuitable, and would present a substantial danger to public safety if released now.

Inmate Hernandez was convicted in 2013 of attempted residential burglary in a case where a man returning home saw Hernandez at his door trying to break in; the victim chased inmate Hernandez, whom he recognized from a prior break-in at the same victim's house in 2011. Inmate Hernandez assaulted this citizen when he was chased and the man was injured. This crime victim certainly does not want inmate Hernandez to be given the benefit of early release. In April 2013, Hernandez got a six year sentence, and at the very earliest should be incarcerated until late 2018 in order to serve the 80% he was sentenced to.

Also, Hernandez has a strike offense from December 2005 for burglary, making it clear that he is a serial burglar.
