Presentation: Health Information Exchange	<p>Nicholas Drews, Program Manager II for San Luis Obispo Health Agency, presented the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Topic of Discussion: Health Information Exchange (HIE) ▪ What is an HIE? <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>“An HIE allows doctors, nurses, pharmacists, other health care providers and patients to appropriately access and securely share a patient’s vital medical information electronically – improving the speed, quality, safety and cost of patient care.”</i> ▪ There are more than 15 community HIEs, with an operational presence in 40 of 58 counties statewide. Unfortunate there is not a lot of consistency and fragmentation, however we are improving the communication so we can provide better healthcare. ▪ SLO 2013 Commitment Letters signed by CEOs at Sierra Vista, French, and Twin Cities hospitals <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ <i>“By signing this commitment letter, the Organization commits to enter into good faith negotiations with the Orange County Partnership Regional Health Information Organization, Inc. (OCPRHIO) as a fellow participant in Healthway’s eHealth Exchange.”</i> <p>Unfortunately, the commitment to go forward with OCPRHIO stalled due to the decision being at the executive level. By 2017 the Health Agency decided to go forward with implication of the Health Information Exchange. Presentation: Telecommunication Technology</p>	<p>Magdalena Serrano, Director of Behavioral Health and Psychiatry Services for Community Health Centers of the Central Coast, presented the following:</p> <p>What is Telehealth Communication?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Telehealth is a broad term which includes the use of electronic information and telecommunications technologies. ▪ Long distance clinical health care, patient and professional health-related education and public health. <p>What is Telemedicine?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Telemedicine is a subset of telehealth. ▪ It includes many medical subspecialties such as Telepediatrics, Telepsychiatry, Teleradiology and Telecardiology. ▪ Telepsychiatry is practiced by using Live videoconferencing system <p>Behavioral Health Integration (BHI): Integrating behavioral health care into primary care through co-locations or collaborative agreements. Recovery rate for patients with behavioral health issues improve by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Increasing access ▪ Decreases barriers ▪ Decreases shame and stigma ▪ Links patient back to clinic ▪ Creates continuity in care ▪ Fosters culture of patient-centric care <p>Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The use of connected electronic tools to record personal health and medical data in one location for review by a provider in another location. <p>Dramatic Savings: With an electronic and connected cloud-based system in place, much of the waste can be curbed. From lab results that reach their destination sooner, improving better and more timely care deliver to reduced malpractice claims, health informatics reduced errors, increases communication, and drives efficiency where before there was costly incompetence and obstruction.</p>		
<p>6. Health Agency / Public Health Report</p>	<p>Dr. Borenstein reported on the following: The Governor released his May revised State Budget and the State is doing phenomenally well economically. The reserves are being contributed to significantly. \$16.5 billion dollars in State reserve is being added. The Health Officers Association of California in concert with the County</p>		

	Health Executives Association of California had asked for \$50 million dollars of State general fund for communicable disease control and the Governor approved \$40 million. \$23 million dollars for home visiting in an addition to the Cal Works money the Legislation put in the beginning of the year. May 17 th is Bike to Work Day. The Health Department along with Parks and Recreation is sponsoring a Bikes and Bites Breakfast on Thursday, May 16, 2019 from 7:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. The event will be located outside the San Luis Obispo Courthouse.		
7. Health Commissioner Updates	<p>Commissioner Warren: The Homeless Services Oversight Committee has been in the news due to receiving funding. There is supposed to be more funding in the fall so hopefully we can pick up programs that were not funded this time around.</p> <p>Commissioner Winstead: The Cal Poly ASMA, Cal Poly Pre-Dental Society and Cal Poly EMS are hosting a SLO GLO 5K on June 1, 2019. The event is from 6:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. and all proceeds will go to 40 Prado.</p> <p>Commissioner Sekayan: The SART Team is holding another training for trauma and form responses to sexual assault. The class will be held at Cuesta College with a fee of \$25.00 dollars which includes lunch.</p> <p>Commissioner Raymond: Attended the Adult Services Policy Council Meeting on May 3, 2019. They gave a presentation on all their resources. They will meet again on June 11, 2019. Wilshire Health and Community Services announced that they will be giving a presentation: The Aging Project, Changing the Way we Approach Aging and Isolation. The event is on May 30, 2019 from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. at the Villages of San Luis Obispo. Attended the Food System Coalition meeting in which they discuss access to food for seniors.</p> <p>Commissioner Byram: Community Health Centers are administering many shots for measles due to outbreak in other areas.</p> <p>Commissioner Kleinman: Attended the Heal SLO Healthy Communities Work Group meeting on May 2, 2019. They discussed the 660 Tank Farm Road and 3985 Broad Street Project. They are looking to build full care assist living, dementia care and shopping centers. Part of the discussion at the meeting was to improve the walkability, safety outside, traffic buildup and air pollution due to trucks Idling.</p> <p>Commissioner Sage: Attended the Human Trafficking Task Force. The Noor Clinic and Cal Poly have a mobile van and will start to go out to the fields. Currently they are working with local massage parlors. The Health Commission Roster and the advisory bodies list has a few errors. Will work with Theresa to update and have her email the updated lists to all of us. The Health Commission next planning retreat will be in a few months, so this is a good time to think of some suggestions for further meetings and into next year.</p>
