Updated Monovalent mRNA COVID-19 Vaccines Authorized ***Bivalent COVID-19 vaccines no longer authorized for use***

This week, the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) authorized updated monovalent mRNA COVID-19 vaccines for 2023-24, and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommended the updated vaccines for everyone ages 6 months and older. The updated vaccines provide improved protection against the strains currently causing the most infections and hospitalizations.

Updated COVID-19 vaccines are currently arriving in San Luis Obispo County and will be available from pharmacies, health care providers, and Public Health clinics. We encourage you to discuss the updated vaccines with your patients and to consider providing them in your office.

Vaccination remains the best protection against COVID-19 related hospitalization and death. It can also reduce the chances of suffering the effects of long COVID.

Updated COVID-19 vaccination recommendations

Current recommendations for the updated vaccines include:

- **Everyone aged 5 years and older** should get 1 updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine to be up to date.
- **People aged 65 years and older** may get a 2nd dose of updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.
- **People who are moderately or severely immunocompromised** may get additional doses of updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.
- **Children aged 6 months–4 years** may need multiple doses of COVID-19 vaccine to be up to date, including at least 1 dose of updated Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine, depending on the number of doses they've previously received and their age.
