ALBUTEROL (Proventil®, Ventolin®)

Classification: Bronchodilator (Beta 2 specific)

Actions:

1. Relaxes bronchial smooth muscle

2. Decreases airway resistance

Indications:

1. Respiratory distress with wheezes/bronchospasm

2. Anaphylaxis with or without shock

3. SOB due to COPD or asthma

Contraindications: Known hypersensitivity to Albuterol

Adverse Effects: Neurological Cardiovascular

Tremors Tachycardia
Headache/dizziness Hypertension
Sweating Dysrythmias

Anxiety Palpitations

Gastrointestinal Nausea/vomiting

Administration: ADULT DOSE

2.5-5 mg via HHN/mask/BVM with adjunct over 5-10 minutes, repeat as needed

PEDIATRIC DOSE

2.5-5 mg via HHN/mask/BVM with adjunct over 5-10 minutes, repeat as needed.

Onset: 5-15 minutes

Duration: 4-6 hours

Notes:

Beta blocking agents inhibit the effects of Albuterol.

 Albuterol should be administered with oxygen, and be sure to closely monitor the patient's vital signs and cardiac status.
