Elizabeth Merson Public Health Emergency Preparedness Program Manager	 CMS Preparedness Rule Proposed Changes (see attached slide show). In the "comment period" of the proposed changes. Highlights: No longer an annual review, the review will now be every 2 years; A functional exercise will be required instead of a full-scale exercise
Ron Alsop County of San Luis Obispo Office of Emergency Services	 Report on PG&E's "Community Wildlife Safety Program Regional Workshop" (see attached handout). Basically, when the power will be shut off when a wildfire is in the area/approaching. Three tiered approach: Tier 1, Tier 2-Elevated, Tier 3-Extreme. Visit pge.com/wildfiresafety to find out if your home or business is served by an electric line that may be turned off for safety during high wildfire threats. Questions: Kerry Boyle asked 1) if the cell towers would be turned off? Ron answered that 76% of Verizon towers have generators and all have battery backups 2) is there a hospital plan for power outage? Christine Gaiger Communicable Disease	 (reported by Elizabeth Merson and James Beebe for Christine Gaiger) For reporting purposes, the flu season began on October 1. Healthcare workers are required to be vaccinated by November 1, or else they will have to wear a mask. Kerry Boyle asked about the recent ricin scare. Dr. Beebe responded that there was No information from CDPH regarding the recent ricin scare. Apparently the letters contained the castor beans, not the powder. Dr. Beebe added that in order to be poisoned by ricin, the beans would have to be mashed up and then ingested. Per Dr. Beebee the number of Valley fever cases has increased considerably. There are 6 times the reported cases this year compared to last year.

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JAMES BEEBE PUBLIC HEALTH LABORATORY	 Infectious Disease Forum—hosted by the PH lab held 9-14-18 with infectious disease, urgent care, public health, and hospital physicians, with clinical, hospital and public health laboratory staff discussed the rapidly changing world of infectious disease laboratory technology. Dr. Beebe proposed the voluntary submission of specimens to the public health laboratory when a molecular amplification test yield a positive result for agents like influenza, norovirus and agents of gastrointestinal illness. Dr. Beebe called this new effort "Extended Laboratory Surveillance" as multiple laboratories are now performing molecular testing. Influenza the submission of a positive influenza molecular test specimen from the Sierra Vista RMC lab initiated surveillance for a new swine flu virus (H1N2v) that infected 4 patients associated with exhibition of swine at the Mid-State Fair. Base on the events of last flu, season the PH lab is acquiring a second thermocycler that can be used to test for influenza using the CDC-developed Rt-PCR assay. This will double the PH lab's surge capacity. SWMHE—the PH lab will conduct a "wet bench" exercise called the 100 specimen challenge at some convenient time in the coming months with goal to perform influenza PCR effectively and efficiently in a specimen surge scenario using two thermocyclers. Electronic connectivity—Dr Beebe will confer with Athena health representative tomorrow 10/5 regarding interfaces for test ordering and result reporting for Dignity Health and Tenethealth hospitals, funded in part by an OES grant award. Animal Health- Public Health conference hosted by the County of SLO PH lab and the Mid-Coast Veterinary Society chapter is scheduled for January 24 2010 at the Ag auditorium, 2156 Sierra Way SLO with attendees from the veterinary community and public health, discussing infectious disease topics of mutual interest with speakers from the California Dept of Public Health and the
