1. <u>Determination of a Quorum and Introductions</u>

A quorum of 16 is established (12 is required).

2. Approval of April Meeting Minutes

A motion by member E. Greening and a second by L. Chipping moves to approve the March and April meeting minutes with no changes. Minutes approved (14-0-3).

3. Ongoing Updates:

a. Rain & Reservoir Report

d. Open Reporting on Water Conservation Opportunities & Information
