## **Advance Directive Health Care Directive**

Advance Planning

- Advance Health
  - o 18 years or older
  - o Specific to State
  - o Versions: Online or Paper
  - Most important considerations: agent, not generally a guideline for care in hospital/clinic
  - o Visit <a href="https://prepareforyourcare.org">https://prepareforyourcare.org</a>
- POLST: Physician Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment
  - o In some states known as MOLST (Medical Orders for Life Sustaining Treatment)
  - o For those with chronic, life limiting illness to record wishes
  - o Not intended for those without chronic, life limiting illness
  - o Most robust way to get your wishes observed by first responders, practitioners
  - o POLST forms are available at your doctor's office or from <a href="https://capolst.org">https://capolst.org</a>

#### Vial of Life

- A great "grab and go" option for EMS and families so that medical information is in one place.
   Families often post the POLST form under the Vial of Life.
- Plastic container with magnet for the refrigerator contains the following information for emergency medical providers: medications, diagnoses, preferred hospitals/physicians, allergies, contact information.

## Optional: Dementia Directive

- o This process takes anywhere from 5 years to 20 years. The average time it takes dementia to progress to a severe form (of not being able to dress or feed oneself) is about 8 years.
- One of the most important questions to consider is: What kind of medical care would you want if you were to develop worsening dementia?

  - Review Rider to Residential Agreement with Assisted-Living Facility as possible addition to your advance directive.
  - o Complete the Hospital Visitation Form. This is especially important for people who are not traditionally recognized family members.
  - o Talk to your healthcare provider. You can use Letter to My Healthcare Provider as an outline for conversation with your provider.
