4.1.1	Discussion Item: Data Assessment Maturity Tool – Action Plan	George reported that HUD (US Department of Housing & Urban Development) released a Data Maturity Assessment Tool which the Finance & Data Committee used in the last meeting to assess SLO County CoC's (Continuum of Care) data quality, analytics capacity, data leadership and systems improvement. The Committee directed County staff to compare the Committee's score with how County staff scored the CoC. This comparison was sent out via email following the meeting. George stated that going forward, one of the most important things to do is to communicate performance measures to key stakeholders, including sharing data with the HSOC and using data more to inform funding decisions.	
		Laurel reported that, as part of the Ten-Year Planning process, County staff and the HSOC will be working with a consultant on a communications strategy, and data will be part of this, so this item will return to the Finance & Data Committee. Some of the CoC's data is very strong, e.g. data related to housing and returns to homelessness. In other areas, the CoC needs to work on improving the data it has, such as shelter data and Coordinated Entry. The Committee discussed issues with collecting data from shelters, such as open enrolment and the impracticality of tracking everyone who attends.	
4.1.2	Discussion Item: Fiscal Year 2022 US Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) HMIS Data Standards updates	George reported that HUD released new HMIS (Homeless Management Information System) data standards that went into effect at the beginning of October. County staff emailed all changes to HMIS users in advance. All revised data standards are now live in HMIS. Carrie commented that education level is now required data in HMIS, but is not included on the HMIS worksheet that the County provides. County staff will update the HMIS form.

	Department of Housing & Urban Development – Veterans Affairs	
	Supportive Housing) data in HMIS, as well as more agencies	
	participating in HMIS, so this should improve the CoC's score this year;	
	however, HUD also includes new data elements each year so it is not	
	always easy to address what they will be looking at.	
	For the new rounds of HHAP (Homeless Housing, Assistance and	
	Prevention Program), the State is instructing CoCs to pick outcomes to	
	achieve with these grants, based on one of HUD's System Performance

4.3 Discussion Item: 2022 Point-In- Time Count	George reported that HUD requires CoCs to conduct a full sheltered and unsheltered PIT (Point in Time) Count once every two years. SLO County CoC was scheduled to carry out a PIT Count in 2021, but a waiver for the unsheltered part of the count was granted due to the pandemic. HUD is now encouraging CoCs to conduct a full sheltered and unsheltered count in 2022. The Fiscal Year 2021 CoC grant application includes points for a commitment to carry this out in January 2022, including a count of homeless youth. The County is currently in the planning process for the 2022 PIT Count. An ad hoc Review Committee was convened to review the proposals for a contractor and select a vendor. Over the next few months, County staff will be working on getting feedback from agencies who participated in previous PIT Counts, and planning for recruiting and training volunteers. Working groups will be convened as part of this process. Janna asked if the PIT Count has to be conducted in the last ten days of January, or if it could be carried out at a later time. County staff will see if there is a waiver for this.

It is noteworthy that through this project, HEAP funds helped create the first year-round homeless shelter in the City of Paso Robles. The shelter is also non-congregate, which has helped reduce spread of COVID-19 among persons experiencing homelessness in Paso Robles. The community of Paso Robles has experienced a higher rate of spread of COVID-19 than other communities in the county, so it was very important to have a non- congregate shelter option. The project filled a critical need of lack of homeless services in the Northern part of San Luis Obispo County. The project created 50 non- congregate emergency shelter shelter beds operated by El Camino Homeless Organization (ECHO) and 63 permanent supportive housing units operated by Housing Authority of San Luis Obispo (HASLO). The project began accepting residents in December 2020. Since then, 236 households have been served by the emergency shelter and 51 households moved into permanent supportive housing during the grant period.

											As a result of HEAP funding for site acquisition, PSHH was able to leverage an extraordinary \$25,437,246 of additional state, local, and private funding. As the first source committed to the project, HEAP was essential to leveraging other sources, ultimately allowing the project to be competitive for No Place Like Home funds. Within a few months of receiving the HEAP award, the Pismo Terrace project applied for and was awarded \$10,435,350 in both capital and operating reserve funding through the No Place Like Home project. The project also leveraged \$2.9 million in in-lieu funds and deferred development impact fees from the City of Pismo Beach, almost \$230,000 in County in-lieu funds, \$350,000 in local housing trust funds, \$13 million in a taxexempt construction loan, \$4 million construction loan,
