<p><b>Justification:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The EHR supports MHS services and programs across the County and its providers, including patient records, data collection, and treatment-wellness-recovery planning.</li> <li>Cerner Corporation, the current EHR vendor has yet to make the current product, the Millennium platform, a fully functional comprehensive platform with the ability to meet the clinical and billing requirements specific to California. Additionally, Cerner Corporation will discontinue the development of any new features or system upgrades to the Anasazi platform after December 2023.</li> <li>CalMHSA will contract with Streamline Healthcare Solutions to offer the SmartCare Enterprise Health Record to counties across California. The implementation of this system is projected to have a go-live date of July 1, 2023.</li> </ul> <p><b>Outcomes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The EHR Program, and the application of centralized services to support multiple counties, will provide for more efficient use of resources, better clinical outcomes, improved adherence to state requirements and reporting, and better overall justification of state spending on specialty mental health and substance use services.</li> </ul>
