

Mental Health First Aid (MHFA)

A skills-based course that gives people the tools to identify, understand, and respond to someone who might be struggling with a mental health or substance use challenge.

Participants will learn about trauma, substance use, self-care, and how to interact with a person in crisis and connect them with help.

- Adult MHFA: focuses on adults 18+.
- **Youth MHFA**: a training for adults who interact with youth 12-18.
- Delivered in person or virtually.
- \$25 per participant.
- Can be held on 1 day or split over 2 days.
- 5 8 hours of instruction.

Learn about the local impact opioid and fentanyl use has on our community as well as practical ways to reduce risk in your community.

Overdose Awareness

Opioid overdose deaths have been steadily increasing each year since 2019 in SLO County.

Cover the most up-to-date local overdose data and trends, local access to harm reduction tools, how opioids can cause an overdose, common risk factors for overdose, and how to respond to an apparent opioid overdose, including the use of the nasal naloxone, Narcan.

 organization and/or client distribution.

Substance Use Education

Community members and organizations may request training on substance use disorders and specific substances including alcohol, cannabis, opioids, illicit drugs, and more.

QPR Gatekeeper Suicide Prevention

QPR stands for Question, Persuade, Refer.

Three simple steps anyone can learn to save a life from suicide. QPR is an emergency mental health intervention that teaches participants how to recognize the warning signs of a suicide crisis and how to question, persuade, and refer someone to help.
