Justification:

- MHSA will expand its Homeless Outreach Team by adopting the Library Outreach Team program that has ended for SLO County Libraries.
- The LOT will work in collaboration with the FSP Homeless Outreach Team program. LOT provides outreach, resources, and support to homeless individuals inside and outside the San Luis Obispo County Libraries. The Contractor's LOT staff will work on-site at designated SLO County Libraries at hours to be determined as the most effective to provide support services. The goal is to contact members of the County's homeless population utilizing library services and provide links and referrals to behavioral health, medical, and social services as needed.
- LOT will perform site-specific outreach services to adults who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless. The Library Outreach Team will help link clients to a wider network of support services, including substance abuse treatment, behavioral health treatment, primary care treatment, housing resources, and financial referrals.
- LOT will provide various services, including individualized planning, case management, referrals to co-occurring drug
 and alcohol services, linkage to medication support and housing resources, and integrated vocational/educational
 services. Also, transportation assistance for clients to attend appropriate behavioral health, medical, vocational, and/or
 educational appointments.

Outcomes:

- One hundred percent (100%) of persons engaged in case management services will access one or more support services, such as substance abuse treatment, vocational training, emotional support, and benefits eligibility.
- 25% of unduplicated persons contacted will be referred to Substance Abuse services.
- 25% of unduplicated persons contacted will be referred to Behavioral Health services.
- 25% of unduplicated persons contacted will be referred to Primary Care Primary Care.
- 25% will be referred to Coordinated Entry Housing program for potential future supportive housing.

On Wednesday, May 31st, 2023: Add additional funding support to TMHA/Library Outreach Program.
