Become a Contact Tracer: Take Our Contact Tracer Interest Survey

We have an exciting opportunity for all our volunteers. We are looking for volunteers to do contact tracing. Contact tracing is the process of identifying and communicating to the people who have been in contact with an infected person (a COVID-19 positive person, in this instance).

The ideal volunteer will have an available schedule and would like to volunteer multiple days a week. A medical or public health background could be helpful.

To become a contact tracer volunteer, there are a few steps you

will need to complete. You must have all your MRC Volunteer onboarding paperwork completed. This is the paperwork most volunteers complete on NEOGOV. If you have not done this, we will need to send you an activation link to access your paperwork. (These links expire in 24 hours. If you are not able to activate it within that time, we will need to resend it.)

Additionally, you will need to complete a 21-hour contact tracing online course. This course is long, but it will ensure that you are prepared to be a thorough contact tracer.

Volunteers wanting to contact trace will be personally vetted by our epidemiology team. If you are not selected, do not worry. We will have many more volunteer opportunities in the future.

If you are interested in becoming a contact tracer volunteer, please fill out this form. (You will not get a confirmation email after completing the form.) We will send out more details as they become available.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: I am only available on certain days; should I let you know?

A: Due to the system we use to send out MRC Volunteer Requests, we are unable to tailor them to specific schedules and preferences. You will get all requests for volunteers. However, if you are not available for an opportunity, that's okay. You can ignore the email. No need to let us know.

Q: I am going back to work and will not be able to volunteer much. What should I do?

A: In this case, we have two options. You can opt to continue receiving all MRC Volunteer Requests and communications and just ignore those that are not relevant to you. We are happy to continue sending you these requests, even if you are not able to sign up.

Or you can opt to be "deactivated" on our roster. If you are "deactivated" you will no longer receive MRC Volunteer Requests. You can email us to "reactivate" your status at any time.

If you would like your status to be "deactivated," <u>please send us an</u> email.

Q: I wanted to sign up to volunteer, but all of the spots were filled. What can I do?

A: The majority of our volunteer opportunities fill quickly. We have some truly amazing and engaged volunteers in the SLO MRC. You are always able to sign up for our On Call List to be contacted should we need you to serve. We frequently use the on call list to fill urgent and emergent needs for volunteers.

A: You can sign up to get tested for COVID-19 at EmergencySLO.org/testing. Please make an appointment.
