1. Agenda Item: Welcome/Introductions/ Updates (Facilitator: Theresa Scott)	The meeting for the San Luis Obispo County Care Coordination Coalition was called to order at 1:45 p.m. by Theresa Scott, Community Relations and Program Development Manager for CenCal Health. Introductions: Everyone present knew each other.	No
2. Agenda Item: Discussion of SB 1152	Theresa Introduced Courtney (Dignity Health). <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Dignity has been working with local homeless groups and Tenet Health in each of their counties. Most of the requirements are not a problem so far (for instance, providing meals and warm clothing as needed). The barriers they (hospital providers) are facing include: after-hours transportation and where to return people after discharge if they do not want to return to their previous living situation. After-hours intake (after 6 pm) for general population shelter folks is still an issue. Working with CAPSLO and other partners on these issues. Next partner meeting set for April 10. Theresa mentioned pilot that was being discussed at the last partner meeting on this subject. Grace submitted a proposal to the hospitals for a pilot that would support these problems. It was submitted to Dignity Executive Leadership. Some of their questions in considering the proposal have been about volume of patients that will need these services. Problem for the system when the location the patient is being discharged to, is not open/available (shelter or not). A discussion continued to talk about what other county's are doing to solve this problem and what to do when there are no more beds at the shelter. Discussion of SB 1152 transitioned into a discussion of a number of other issues related to coordinating care with CenCal, hospitals, CHC, etc., when to refer to CenCal Case Management, how to get healthcare navigation for some of the clients before they leave the clinic setting.

3. Agenda Item: Review Minutes- Dual County Meeting January 17, 2019	Theresa Scott discussed the items from the last Dual County Care Coordination Coalition meeting (in Santa Maria at Marian Medical Center). Minutes were approved as is.	Yes
4. Agenda Item: Discuss Draft Charter and Objectives	<p>Theresa led discussion on draft charter prepared by Michelle Shoresman. She gave background on how and why it was written and shared the Access to Care Worksheets from the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) Planning Process begun by County Public Health in 2017. The goal of the Charter is to give the SLO County Care Coordination Work Group going forward into 2019.</p> <p>Suggestions for the Draft Charter:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Add Timelines – when monthly meetings will be, etc. Add Confidentiality Statement If someone is unable to attend, members should send a proxy to keep communication channels going. Add Dual County focus...focus on “we” before “me” and keeping the interests of the community above those of our individual organizations. Michelle/Theresa to make suggested changes and send back out to the group for approval at next meeting. <p>Second part of this discussion was focused on coming up with concrete objectives for the year for the Care Coordination Group to compliment the Charter.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reviewed CHIP Access to Care Worksheets/Progress to date. Asked for volunteers for Executive Committee. Only entails one planning phone call to prepare agendas for meetings. Reach out to Theresa or Michelle if you are interested. Discussion about 211...group asked what is the current process for updating 211. Maybe this should be one of the Care Coordination Group’s objectives for the year. Reviewed Break Out Session lists from last year’s Dual County Care Coordination Meeting. Some ideas: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Increase sober living homes that allow medications. How do we get more? (Is this a licensing issue? What controls how this managed? Should we have a speaker on this in the future?) More 24 hour BH Care beds in the County needed. The need for BH Care impacts hospitals and ability to discharge patients. Ron Yukelson talked about Full Service Partnership as one resource, but many agreed it’s not enough. Outpatient, inpatient beds and beds for adolescents are needed. Ron Yukelson mentioned Cottage ER Model as an example: The ERHU (ER Holding Unit) has a Social Worker, Psych Techs, and a Psychiatrist that comes through periodically. Psychiatrists there are trained to write 5150s and release people from 5150. This has been expensive for Cottage, but it is worth it for the reduced impact it has had on their ER. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Perhaps enough potential clients for a juvenile CSU to be shared between Monterey, SLO and SB counties? Recruit training/feeder program for mid-level professionals, also in Mental Health specialties. There is a university that would like to set up a program in Santa Maria. Theresa discussed the visit from the California Wellness Trust in February. The Wellness Trust is working on a bill to go before the 	<p>Get Star to come to a future meeting and talk about efforts to get Sober Living Homes to accept medications.</p> <p>Obtain information of Sober Living Intake Process/Requirements</p>

	state legislature to create an ongoing trust fund to support health prevention activities across the state. She described a summer camp idea that would focus on healthy activity, childhood obesity, etc. Others suggested targets on foster youth, etc. as the target.
