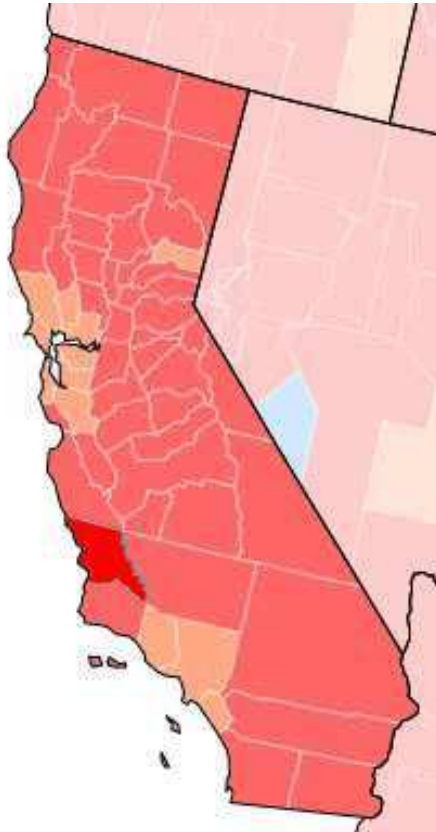

of deaths

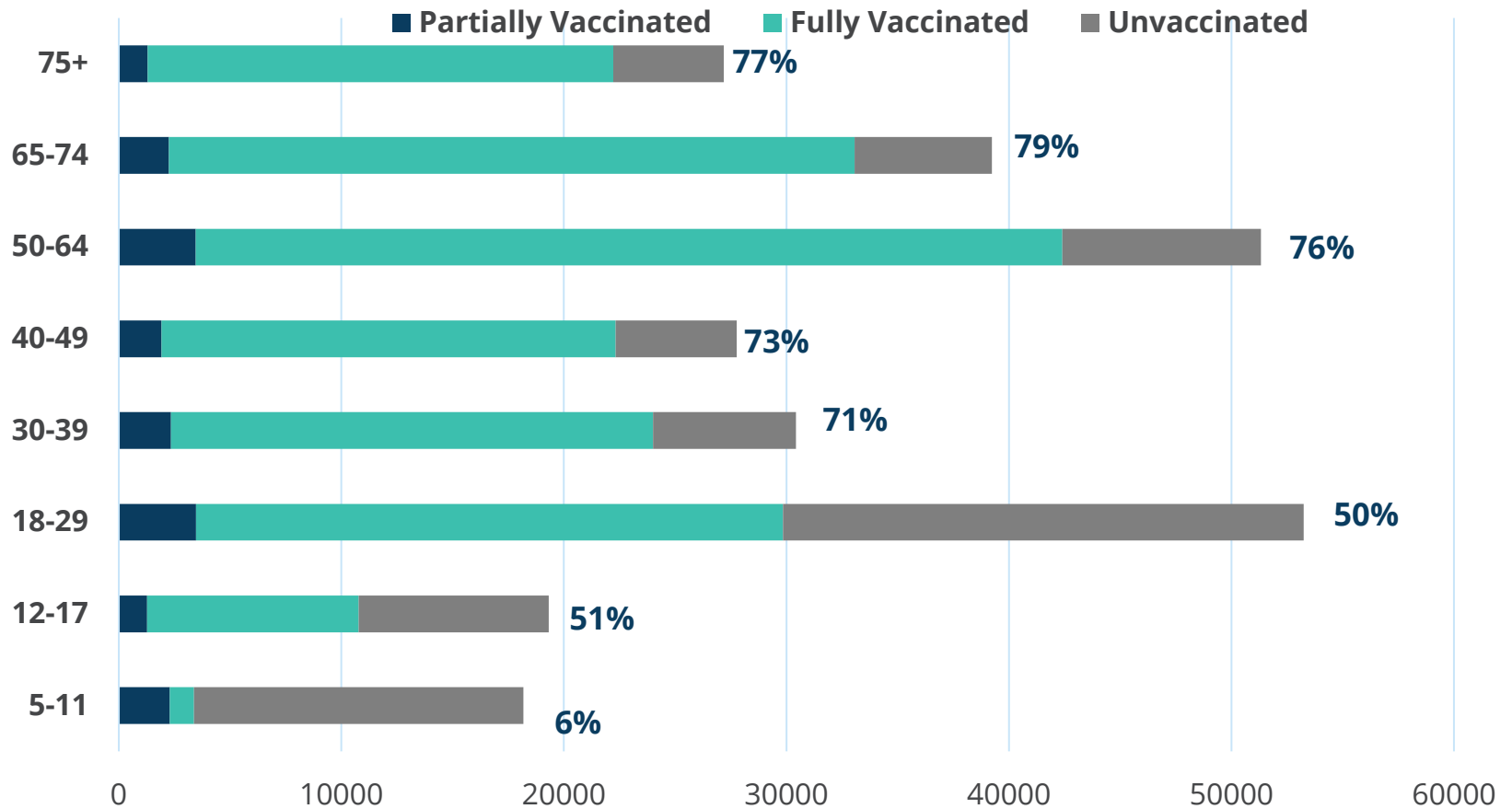

DoF Pop Estimates (2021) and Snowflake Local Health Jurisdiction Data (12/06/21)



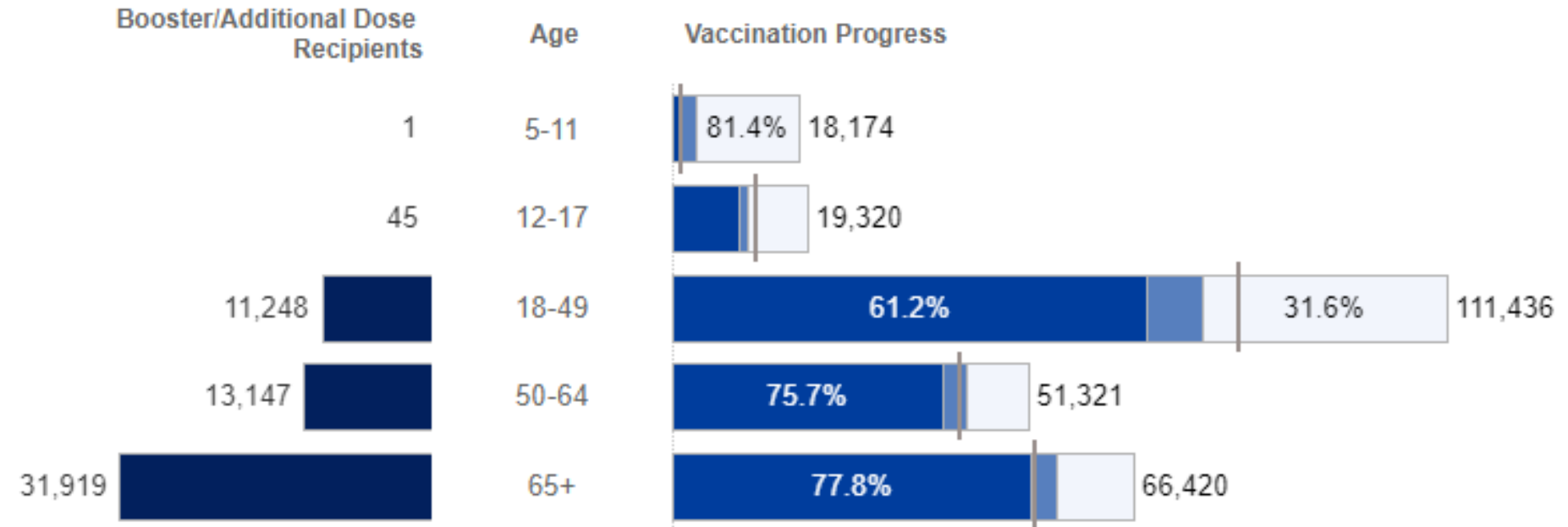
Vaccination Rates

	Statewide	SLO County
Partially vaccinated	8.5%	7.0%
Fully vaccinated	68.5%	63.5%
Total	76.9%	70.5%

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Omicron

- New variants will continue to evolve as long as there are large proportions of unvaccinated people.
- Variant has many mutations which impacts infectiousness and the ability for immune systems to protect against infection.
- Unknown whether Omicron variant causes more severe illness than other variants or how it might impact response to treatment.

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Boosters

- Recommended for anyone 18+ following completion of their primary series
 - **Pfizer:** at least 6 months after completion of the initial vaccine series
 - **Moderna:** at least 6 months after completion of the initial vaccine series
 - **Johnson & Johnson:** at least 2 months after completion of the initial vaccine series
- Boosters are especially important for those at higher risk:
 - Age 50+
 - Resident of long term care facility
 - Underlying medical condition or increased risk of social inequities
 - Risk of exposure from work or residence
