SPECIMEN COLLECTION & TRANSPORT INSTRUCTIONS

BLOOD AND SMEARS FOR PARASITE EXAMINATION

SPECIMEN STORAGE & TRANSPORT

• Temperature: Room temperature (15–25 °C/59–77 °F)

ACCEPTABLE SPECIMEN TYPES

EDTA blood tube

TEST ORDER OPTIONS FOR THIS TEST

• 4040: Blood smear for parasites

SPECIMEN COLLECTION

- 1. Collect venous blood in an EDTA tube, with the draw date and time as well as the patient's name marked on the tube.
- Make a minimum of two (2) thick and two (2) thin smears as soon as possible or WITHIN 4 HOURS OF COLLECTION. DO NOT FIX.
 - o Smears may be prepared from venous or capillary blood.
 - Stained smears (e.g., Giemsa) may also be submitted.

SPECIMEN STORAGE & TRANSPORT

- 1. Optimally, the above EDTA tube and subsequent smears should be **delivered to the Public Health Laboratory on the same day it is collected.**
- 2. If there is a delay in transport, refrigerate the EDTA blood and blood smear(s) and deliver as quickly as possible to the Public Health Laboratory.
- 3. Alternatively, the patient can contact the Public Health Department at (805) 781-5500 to make an appointment for a blood draw to avoid any transport delays.
