



Construction/Demolition Recycling Requirements and Exemptions

Review the table below to see if your project is required to recycle.

Find your project on the left column;

1. Read across to see if it has a check (✓) mark;
2. Look at the column header for that checked column.
3. If your project fits that description, then you must recycle 75% of the waste; unless, as shown below, if you are removing asphalt or concrete (100% must be recycled).

<sup>1</sup> Categorically Exempt: To be exempt, metal buildings and cell/wireless facilities must have all metal or concrete studs, walls, roof, and no drywall or interior walls. All new mobile homes are exempt. Exempted mobile homes, metal buildings, and cell/wireless facilities do not have a recycling fee.

If any project that is required to recycle fails to comply, a Code Enforcement Case will be initiated with resulting fees and may delay the Final Building Inspection approval.
