- Less than 25 mrem Remediation Threshold: Considering all of the planning that REACH, Cal Poly and other green energy stakeholders vision for the future use of Parcel P the County can and should require PG&E to a lower than 25mrem Remediation Threshold, reducing the inherent risk of radiological exposure at the site.
- The County as the issuer of the Development Plan/Coastal Development Permit and Conditional Use Permit has the authority to set the radiation level to a no-to-exceed 10 mrem level, and should not wait until another State Agency requires it.

- The PRE is old and outdated, as indicated on the last Parks and Recreation Commissions annual report. In 2003-2005 when were working on the current PRE we never envisioned planning for access as at the time there was no discussion of the decommissioning of Diablo Canyon.
- Connecting Montana de Oro SP to Wild Cherry Canyon has been a goal of the SLO Co Trail Advisory Committee, CA Coastal District Trail Committee, Central Coast Concerned Mountain Bikers, Los Padres Back Country Horseman, Atascadero Horsemen, and many other equestrian groups.
- County DEIR should support both a multi-use trail on the coastal bluff and an interior trail to connect Montana de Oro to Wild Cherry Canyon.
