Question 1: Which policy is the primary regulation for stormwater discharge in California?	A. National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES)
Question 2: What size project is required to enroll in the Construction General Permit (CGP) in California?	B. Construction projects greater than 1.0 acre, or less than 1.0 acre if part of a larger common plan of development.
Question 3: Who is the Legally Responsible Person (LRP) responsible for obtaining permit coverage and ensuring stormwater permit compliance throughout a construction project?	B. The project proponent or owner.
Question 4: What are Permit Registration Documents (PRDs)?	C. The documents that must be uploaded to the State Water Resources Control Board to complete enrollment and registration in the Construction General Permit.
Question 5: What is a Waste Discharger Identification Number (WDID#)?	A. A number automatically issued online by the State Water Resources Control Board to a construction site when it is fully enrolled in the Construction General Permit.
Question 6: What documents comprise the Permit Registration Documents (PRDs)?	C. The Construction SWPPP, Notice of Intent, Risk Assessment, Site Map, Annual Fee, Certification, and potentially others (depending on project type and location).
Question 7: What certification is required for a preparer of a construction stormwater pollution prevention plan (SWPPP) for a site?	A. Qualified SWPPP Developer (QSD)
Question 8: What is the role of a Qualified SWPPP Practitioner (QSP) at a construction site?	B. Evaluate project compliance with the CGP on an ongoing basis, support stormwater management and BMP implementation on site.
Question 9: Are stormwater requirements relaxed during the dry season?	C. No. The full scope of requirements for inspections, reporting, and BMPs remain in effect during the full calendar year.
Question 10: Are stormwater requirements relaxed once project grading is complete?	B. No. All provisions including BMPs, sampling, inspections, and reporting remain in effect through completion of the project.
