1. Call to Order and Introductions

Michelle Shoresman called the meeting to order at 3:03pm.

Jack Lahey also provided an example of the efficiency of the HMIS system. He shared that within the span of three hours, they were able to see accurate and live data to address the needs of a high need participant. The system was fast and quick, client's history was on HMIS screen. Phase 2 emphasis will be on operational reporting and about providing HSOC and Board of Supervisors, and other agencies the data needed about the HMIS project.

ITEM: Vote to Recommend Nine Persons for Appointment to Vacant or Expiring Seats on the Homeless Services Oversight Council

ACTION REQUIRED: It is requested that the Homeless Services Oversight Council (HSOC) Executive Committee: approve the nominations of Abby Lassen for a second term for the At Large seat she currently holds, in the category of Advocates; Kristee Klein for a first term for the At Large seat currently held by Allison Brandum, in the category of Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons; Raven Lopez for a first term for the Behavioral Health Agencies seat currently held by Aurora William; Benjamin Albracht for a first term for the Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans seat currently held by Bill Crewe; Brenda Mack for a third term for the Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons seat she currently holds; Jim Dantona for a second term for the Businesses seat he currently holds; Rick Scott for a second term for the Law Enforcement seat he currently holds; Susan Lamont for a third term for the Victim Service Providers seat she currently holds; and Ilene Brill for a first term for the Faith-Based Organizations seat formerly held by Shay Stewart; and recommend them to the Homeless Services Oversight Council for appointment.

SUMMARY NARRATIVE:

There are 36 membership seats on the HSOC. Members are appointed to the HSOC by the County Board of Supervisors, with the exception of seven seats reserved for the representatives of the seven incorporated cities. These seven seats are held by City Council members who are appointed by their respective City Councils.

With the exception of the seats reserved for elected officials, and the Youth Advisory Board seat, members are appointed to three-year terms. To ensure continuity of the HSOC, term expirations are staggered among the seats, such that approximately 1/3 of the seats expire in a given year. Terms expire in January of the year in which the term ends. There is no restriction on the number of terms a member may serve.

There are currently eight seats due to expire in January 2025. Six of these seats are tied to a specific category and can only be held by a representative from that category (Behavioral Health Agencies, Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans, Currently or

Formerly Homeless Persons, Businesses, Law Enforcement and Victim Service Providers). The two remaining seats are At Large seats, meaning they may be held by a representative from any of the following categories: County Government Service Providers, Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons, Advocates, Affordable Housing Developers, Businesses, Faith-Based Organizations, Hospitals, Public Safety Organizations, Behavioral Health Agencies, Nonprofit Homeless Assistance Providers, Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans, Housing Authority, County Office of Education, Local School Districts, Social Service Providers, Victim Service Providers, and Other Community Organizations.

In addition, there is one vacant seat. This seat is tied to a specific category and can only be held by a representative from that category (Faith-Based Organizations).

At the September 2024 HSOC meeting, expiring membership terms were reviewed and a request was made for applications from the public. A total of twenty-two applications were received. An ad hoc Nominating Committee met in October to consider the applications and recommended the following nine candidates for seats on the HSOC for terms beginning in January 2025:

Abby Lassen for an At Large seat in the Advocates category, for a term expiring in January 2028. Abby is a current member of the HSOC Services Coordinating Committee, and was a member of the HSOC Alternatives to Encampment Subcommittee. She has also served as Board member and employee of 5Cities Homeless Coalition and County of San Luis Obispo Health Equity Coordinator. She has represented people experiencing homelessness as an attorney with California Rural Legal Assistance.

Benjamin Albracht for the Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Benjamin is a Board member for SLO County Veteran's Collaborative, and a Senior Social Worker for Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing in SLO, as well as having firsthand experience as a former homeless veteran.

Brenda Mack for the Currently or Formerly Homeless Person seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Brenda has served as a volunteer for Transitions Mental Health Association's Life House clinic, currently serves as Housing Chair of SLO NAACP, and has worked as a Psychiatric Technician. She has also volunteered with community-based organizations to advocate on behalf of people experiencing homelessness and mental illness.

Ilene Brill for the Faith-Based Organizations seat for a term that will expire January 2027. Ilene is Intake Coordinator at Jewish Family Services of San Luis Obispo and a member of the SLO Commission on Aging.

Action Item 4.1.1

Jim Dantona for the Businesses seat, for a term expiring in January 2028. Jim serves as the CEO for the SLO Chamber of Commerce, the largest organization in the county representing businesses. The Chamber of Commerce works closely with the business community on engaging and understanding how to work with government and the local unhoused community.

Kristee Klein for an At Large seat in the Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons category for a term that will expire January 2028. Kristee has firsthand experience with homelessness.

Raven Lopez for the Behavioral Health Agencies seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Raven is Director of Fiscal Policy for the County Behavioral Health Directors Association of CA.

Rick Scott for the Public Safety Organizations seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Rick is Chief of Police for the San Luis Obispo Police Department, as well as Executive Board Member for Grizzly Academy and a Board Member for Lumina Alliance.

Susan Lamont for the Victim Service Providers seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Susan is the Interim Chief Program Officer for Lumina Alliance, which provides services and shelter to persons fleeing from intimate partner violence, and was formerly the Associate Director for RISE. In addition to her experience at RISE and Lumina Alliance, Susan has previously worked at the LINK in Atascadero and served as a patient advocate in Colorado.

BUDGET/FINANCIAL IMPACT

No current fiscal impact is anticipated.

STAFF COMMENTS:

It is recommended that the Homeless Services Oversight Council Executive Committee approve this item. Upon the HSOC's approval, staff will submit a recommendation for appointment to the full HSOC.

As Intake Coordinator for JFS, I interact with clients and other agencies, facilitate the delivery of assistance, and provide resources to residents of SLO County (regardless of their circumstances, religious beliefs, race, ethnicity, national origin, diversability, gender identity/expression or sexual orientation) who are in financial need (income 200% below the poverty line). 30% of the people contacting our organization are unhoused. I provide support services such as paying for storage fees, DMV registration, propane and gasoline, impound fees and more as well as referrals to other community organizations. I work in partnership with over 70 local agencies including 40 Prado, ECHO, the 5 Cities Homeless Coalition, SSVF, and TMHA to meet the emergency needs of our clients. In addition, I collect, analyze and interpret demographic data from the interviews I conduct and the applications submitted by clients to write grants and reports. As a member of the SLO Commission on Aging, I stay informed about issues specifically faced by homeless seniors and work directly with other members to address their needs and concerns. My knowledge of issues relating to homelessness has primarily been derived from my own personal experiences. I understand the effects of PTSD and problems that "snowball", how teens & females are particularly vulnerable to predators, and at my age I'm finally no longer embarrassed to talk about anything.

I also feel for the many veterans living without a home... my husband was a Vietnam War veteran who could not overcome the horrors he witnessed and the treatment he received after returning to the United States. He left when our children were very young, and eventually died of a drug overdose. I wish I knew then at least some of what I understood later after attaining more knowledge & education.

Since that time I've spent countless hours in therapy, and went back to school as a single parent when I was 30 years old. I never graduated from high school, but proudly earned two bachelor's degrees (magna cum laude, Anthropology & Psychology) and completed two years of graduate school in Applied Anthropology. This in turn allowed me to earn higher wages, which eventually led to the purchase of my own home, which as you can imagine was especially meaningful to me.

At a weekend seminar I attended several years ago, when asked a general question about our greatest achievement in life, I answered that I survived without ever being beaten, raped, or killed. That got a laugh when the instructor said "that's a pretty low bar" and I laughed along with them at the time, but later I realized and positively concluded that is indeed my greatest achievement in life because of those years I spent living on the street, and I am so proud of it... no judgment towards those who do not understand that sentiment, because I definitely get it to the core of my being and that's all that matters to me, because I have lived it (and survived).

Well, I'm not sure what help I could be, but that's about it in a nutshell... sorry for the last minute submission, and thanks for listening.

ITEM: Vote to select the Calle Joaquin project from People's Self-Help Housing as the project for which the San Luis Obispo County Continuum of Care (CoC) would be seeking CoC Builds funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development

ACTION REQUIRED:

Vote to select the Calle Joaquin project from People's Self-Help Housing as the project for which the CoC would be seeking CoC Builds funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

SUMMARY NARRATIVE:

On July 22, 2024, HUD released a Notice of Funding Opportunity¹ for the CoC Builds program, a one-time, competitive grant to CoCs to create additional permanent supportive housing (PSH) units in selected communities around the country. PSH is subsidized, permanent housing in which supportive services are provided to assist individuals with a disability and families where at least one household member has a disability and is experiencing homelessness to live independently.

To be considered for funding, CoCs must select one project for which to apply within the CoC's geographic area. Eligible activities include acquisition, construction or rehabilitation to create new permanent housing units. At least 80% of a grant award must be used for capital costs and no more than 10% may be used for project administration costs. Activities are authorized under the federal Continuum of Care program.

All applications from CoCs must be submitted to HUD no later than November 24, 2024. Applications are required to include a letter of support from the Chair of the CoC in order to be considered by HUD.

On August 1, 2024, the County released a local Request for Proposals to select a project for an application to HUD. One application was received from People's Self-Help Housing (PSHH) for development of the Calle Joaquin permanent supportive housing program. PSHH is

proposing to use CoC Builds funding to rehabilitate units to make them eligible for Project Based Housing Vouchers that will provide a source of ongoing operations funding for the housing and to make additional renovations to support the operation of the site as PSH.

A non-conflicted grant review committee was convened on 9/10/24 to review the application. The committee included a member of the HSOC, and persons with expertise related to the affordable development of homeless services.

The committee members considered financial capacity, project design, permitting and site control, organizational capacity, and proposed design of the project. The committee felt that PSHH had the financial and organizational capacity and experience to allow them to be successful in the project. However, because of time restrictions related to other funding already awarded to the project and HUD requirements about timing of environmental reviews, timing concerns had not been fully resolved in time for the committee to make its recommendations. Thus, the committee conditionally recommended the application, contingent on these concerns being addressed.

On September 18, 2024, the HSOC met and voted to conditionally recommend the application from PSHH. The HSOC also voted to give the Executive Committee final authority to select PSHH's application in order to give staff time to work with PSHH, the City of San Luis Obispo, and HUD to determine whether the timelines for the environmental review would be a barrier to the viability of the project.

Staff have consulted with PSHH, HUD, and the City of SLO and have received further clarification from HUD regarding environmental review requirements specific to the CoC Builds Program. Based on this additional information, staff recommend proceeding with the selection of the Calle Joaquin Project and proceeding with the application.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS:

The San Luis Obispo County Continuum of Care is eligible to receive up to \$5 million in onetime funding. The CoC Builds NOFO competition will be highly competitive. HUD expects to fund only 25 applications nationwide.

STAFF COMMENTS:

Staff recommend approval of the requested action.
