### 1. Call to Order and Introductions

Chairperson Michelle Shoresman called the meeting to order at 1:04 pm. Introductions were made by those new to the meeting.

#### 2. Public Comments

Aurora William shared that she and Abby Lassen Lassen have been working together and have updated the San Luis Obispo County Community Resource Brochure. This brochure contains contact information and an overview of services from community agencies who serve unhoused persons. Copies can be ordered from Burdine printing at (805) 489-4910.

Wendy Lewis shared that ECHO (El Camino Homeless Organization) is having a fundraiser and an awareness walk this Saturday in Atascadero at 10:30am. More information is available at echoshelter.org.

Zara Landrum expressed her appreciation to Jack Lahey, Wendy Blacker, Aurora William and Linda Belch for participating in the Morro Bay town hall meeting held last Sunday.

## 3. Consent: Approval of Minutes

Susan Funk moved the motion for minutes to be approved, seconded by Janna Nichols. Minutes passed via voice vote.

### 4. Action/Information/Discussion

#### 4.1. HSOC Administration

**4.1.1.** Information Item: HSOC Membership Call for Applications to Fill Vacant and Expiring Seats

Laurel Weir shared the following seats are expiring in January 2025: County Government Service Providers, Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons, Advocates, Public Safety Organizations, Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans, Victim Service Providers, Behavioral Health Agencies, and Businesses. There are two vacant seats, namely Faith-Based Organizations and the Youth Board. Application forms are available at the County website. October 7 is the deadline for applications.

# 4.2. Implementing Five-Year Plan Line of Effort 1 - Create Affordable and Appropriately Designed Housing Opportunities and Shelter Options for Underserved Populations

**4.2.1.** Action Item: Vote to 1) Make funding recommendations for up to \$2,034,933 in Fiscal Year 2024 Funding from the Annual Continuum of Care (CoC) Grant from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); 2) Approve rankings of proposed projects; and 3) Authorize the County as the Collaborative Applicant to prepare and submit the Collaborative Application and all related documents to HUD

Erica Jaramillo presented slides which provided summarized narrative of the funding background, project selection and review process, and the Grant Review Committee agency recommendations. Susan Funk moved the motion to approve the said recommendations. Cathy McClenathen seconded the motion. The motion passed via roll call.

**4.2.2.** Action Item: Vote to 1) authorize the County as the CoC Collaborative Applicant to submit an application for CoC Builds program funding from HUD; 2) conditionally select the Calle Joaquin project from People's Self-Help Housing as the project for which the CoC would be seeking CoC Builds funding; 3) authorize the HSOC Executive Committee to

provide final approval of a project to submit for the CoC Builds funding, and 4) authorize the Chair of the HSOC to sign a letter on behalf of the HSOC in support of the CoC Builds application

Laurel Weir shared summarized information regarding approval of the requested actions. Janna Nichols moved to approve the motion, and Kristen Barneich seconded. Roll was called and the motion passed.

**4.2.3.** Information Item: Planning for 2025-2029 Consolidated Plan for HUD Community Development Block Grant, HOME, and Emergency Solutions Grant Funding

George Solis provided information regarding the 2025 Consolidated Plan Process 2025 Community Development Needs Assessment.

**4.2.4.** Information Item: Notice of Funding Availability for 2025 Annual Action Plan Grants, Permanent Local Housing Allocation grants, and General Fund Support grants for homeless assistance

George Solis shared that NOFA (Notice of Funding Availability) was released on September 3. Applications must be submitted electronically via Neighborly software no later than October 6 by 11:59pm. NOFA is posted on the County's Department of Social Homeless Services Division website at <a href="slocounty.gov/HomelessServicesGrants">slocounty.gov/HomelessServicesGrants</a>

# 4.3. Implementing Five-Year Plan Line of Effort 4 – Create, Identify, and Streamline Funding and Resources

**4.3.1.** Action Item: Vote to use Homeless Housing, Assistance and Prevention (HHAP) Program earned interest from Rounds 1 and 2 to fund a pilot, overnight parking program for individuals living in their vehicles

George Solis reported that Year 1 of the San Luis Obispo Countywide Plan to Address Homelessness included adding smaller scale parking programs with Housing Navigation assistance. He also showed a slide featuring the HHAP-1 and HHAP-2 interests earned as of June 30, 2024.

Jack Lahey moved the motion to approve the recommended action, Mark Lamore seconded. Roll was called and the motion passed.

### 4.4. Discussion Item: Committee Updates

Mark Lamore mentioned that the Data & Performance Committee is continuing with the updates on the procedures on the HMIS system. The team is also working on data quality management. He also mentioned that the data workgroup is working on how to report out data to HSOC and other groups.

Jack Lahey shared that Coordinated Entry Committee is still working on its principle-based policies. He also mentioned that Interviews for a new CE staff person for CAPSLO (Community Action Partnership of San Luis Obispo) is ongoing this week.

Laurel Weir reported that Services Coordinating Committee has been working on changing its focus and to do deeper dives in certain issues such as encampment issues and warming/cooling centers.

Michelle Shoresman shared an update on the Grants Review Committee. The group has met once and will have two more meetings in the future.

**ITEM:** Vote to Recommend Nine Persons for Appointment to Vacant or Expiring Seats on the Homeless Services Oversight Council

**ACTION REQUIRED:** It is requested that the Homeless Services Oversight Council (HSOC): approve the nominations of Abby Lassen for a second term for the At Large seat she currently holds, in the category of Advocates; Allison Brandum for a second term for the At Large seat she currently holds, in the category of Advocates; Benjamin Albracht for a first term for the Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans seat currently held by Bill Crewe; Brenda Mack for a third term for the Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons seat she currently holds; Ilene Brill for a first term for the Faith-Based Organizations seat formerly held by Shay Stewart; Jim Dantona for a second term for the Businesses seat he currently holds; Raven Lopez for a first term for the Behavioral Health Agencies seat currently held by Aurora William; Rick Scott for a second term for the Law Enforcement seat he currently holds; and Susan Lamont for a third term for the Victim Service Providers seat she currently holds; and recommend them to the County of San Luis Obispo Board of Supervisors for appointment to the HSOC.

#### **SUMMARY NARRATIVE:**

There are 36 membership seats on the HSOC. Members are appointed to the HSOC by the County Board of Supervisors, with the exception of seven seats reserved for the representatives of the seven incorporated cities. These seven seats are held by City Council members who are appointed by their respective City Councils.

With the exception of the seats reserved for elected officials, and the Youth Advisory Board seat, members are appointed to three-year terms. To ensure continuity of the HSOC, term expirations are staggered among the seats, such that approximately 1/3 of the seats expire in a given year. Terms expire in January of the year in which the term ends. There is no restriction on the number of terms a member may serve.

There are currently eight seats due to expire in January 2025. Six of these seats are tied to a specific category and can only be held by a representative from that category (Behavioral Health Agencies, Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans, Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons, Businesses, Law Enforcement and Victim Service

Providers). The two remaining seats are At Large seats, meaning they may be held by a representative from any of the following categories: County Government Service Providers, Currently or Formerly Homeless Persons, Advocates, Affordable Housing Developers, Businesses, Faith-Based Organizations, Hospitals, Public Safety Organizations, Behavioral Health Agencies, Nonprofit Homeless Assistance Providers, Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans, Housing Authority, County Office of Education, Local School Districts, Social Service Providers, Victim Service Providers, and Other Community Organizations.

In addition, there is one vacant seat. This seat is tied to a specific category and can only be held by a representative from that category (Faith-Based Organizations).

At the September 2024 HSOC meeting, expiring membership terms were reviewed and a request was made for applications from the public. A total of twenty-two applications were received. An ad hoc Nominating Committee met in October to consider the applications and make a recommendation. This recommendation and all applications were reviewed by the HSOC Executive Committee at its regular November meeting. The HSOC Executive Committee recommends the following nine candidates for seats on the HSOC for terms beginning in January 2025:

Abby Lassen for an At Large seat in the Advocates category, for a term expiring in January 2028. Abby is a current member of the HSOC Services Coordinating Committee, and was a member of the HSOC Alternatives to Encampment Subcommittee. She has also served as Board member and employee of 5Cities Homeless Coalition and County of San Luis Obispo Health Equity Coordinator. She has represented people experiencing homelessness as an attorney with California Rural Legal Assistance.

Allison Brandum for an at large seat in the Advocates category for a term that will expire January 2028. Allison is a volunteer with Team Rubicon USA and an advocate for the needs of people experiencing homelessness in the community, including providing outreach and medical care to people living in encampments.

Benjamin Albracht for the Organizations Serving Homeless Veterans seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Benjamin is a Board member for SLO County Veteran's Collaborative, and a Senior Social Worker for Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing in SLO, as well as having firsthand experience as a former homeless veteran.

Brenda Mack for the Currently or Formerly Homeless Person seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Brenda has served as a volunteer for Transitions Mental Health Association's Life House clinic, currently serves as Housing Chair of SLO NAACP, and has worked as a Psychiatric Technician. She has also volunteered with community-

based organizations to advocate on behalf of people experiencing homelessness and mental illness.

Ilene Brill for the Faith-Based Organizations seat for a term that will expire January 2027. Ilene is Intake Coordinator at Jewish Family Services of San Luis Obispo and a member of the SLO Commission on Aging.

Jim Dantona for the Businesses seat, for a term expiring in January 2028. Jim serves as the CEO for the SLO Chamber of Commerce, the largest organization in the county representing businesses. The Chamber of Commerce works closely with the business community on engaging and understanding how to work with government and the local unhoused community.

Raven Lopez for the Behavioral Health Agencies seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Raven is Director of Fiscal Policy for the County Behavioral Health Directors Association of CA.

Rick Scott for the Public Safety Organizations seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Rick is Chief of Police for the San Luis Obispo Police Department, as well as Executive Board Member for Grizzly Academy and a Board Member for Lumina Alliance.

Susan Lamont for the Victim Service Providers seat for a term that will expire January 2028. Susan is the Interim Chief Program Officer for Lumina Alliance, which provides services and shelter to persons fleeing from intimate partner violence, and was formerly the Associate Director for RISE. In addition to her experience at RISE and Lumina Alliance, Susan has previously worked at the LINK in Atascadero and served as a patient advocate in Colorado.

#### **BUDGET/FINANCIAL IMPACT**

No current fiscal impact is anticipated.

### **STAFF COMMENTS:**

It is recommended that the Homeless Services Oversight Council approve this item. Upon the HSOC's approval, staff will submit a recommendation for appointment to the Board of Supervisors in December.

As Intake Coordinator for JFS, I interact with clients and other agencies, facilitate the delivery of assistance, and provide resources to residents of SLO County (regardless of their circumstances, religious beliefs, race, ethnicity, national origin, diversability, gender identity/expression or sexual orientation) who are in financial need (income 200% below the poverty line). 30% of the people contacting our organization are unhoused. I provide support services such as paying for storage fees, DMV registration, propane and gasoline, impound fees and more as well as referrals to other community organizations. I work in partnership with over 70 local agencies including 40 Prado, ECHO, the 5 Cities Homeless Coalition, SSVF, and TMHA to meet the emergency needs of our clients. In addition, I collect, analyze and interpret demographic data from the interviews I conduct and the applications submitted by clients to write grants and reports. As a member of the SLO Commission on Aging, I stay informed about issues specifically faced by homeless seniors and work directly with other members to address their needs and concerns. In my role as an EFSP Board Member, I participate in determining how grant funds for local homeless service providers are distributed.

As Intake Coordinator for JFS, I'm in direct contact with the homeless. Part of our eligibility process involves a detailed phone interview to determine the client's needs and how to achieve the best positive outcomes. The issues I discuss with the unhoused include: fear of police impounding the vehicle they're living in because it's not registered or insured (lack of safe parking), food insecurity, and the shortage of shelter beds, hotel vouchers, and affordable housing. The relationships I've established with other area social service organizations is vital in achieving our agency's mission. My participation on the Commission on Aging and ESFP boards keeps me engaged in community affairs and involved with other service providers, offering opportunities to collaborate and expand services.

My knowledge of issues relating to homelessness has primarily been derived from my own personal experiences. I understand the effects of PTSD and problems that "snowball", how teens & females are particularly vulnerable to predators, and at my age I'm finally no longer embarrassed to talk about anything.

I also feel for the many veterans living without a home... my husband was a Vietnam War veteran who could not overcome the horrors he witnessed and the treatment he received after returning to the United States. He left when our children were very young, and eventually died of a drug overdose. I wish I knew then at least some of what I understood later after attaining more knowledge & education.

Since that time I've spent countless hours in therapy, and went back to school as a single parent when I was 30 years old. I never graduated from high school, but proudly earned two bachelor's degrees (magna cum laude, Anthropology & Psychology) and completed two years of graduate school in Applied Anthropology. This in turn allowed me to earn higher wages, which eventually led to the purchase of my own home, which as you can imagine was especially meaningful to me.

At a weekend seminar I attended several years ago, when asked a general question about our greatest achievement in life, I answered that I survived without ever being beaten, raped, or killed. That got a laugh when the instructor said "that's a pretty low bar" and I laughed along with them at the time, but later I realized and positively concluded that is indeed my greatest achievement in life because of those years I spent living on the street, and I am so proud of it... no judgment towards those who do not understand that sentiment, because I definitely get it to the core of my being and that's all that matters to me, because I have lived it (and survived).

Well, I'm not sure what help I could be, but that's about it in a nutshell... sorry for the last minute submission, and thanks for listening.

ACTION ITEM: VOTE TO RECOMMEND AMENDING COUNTY OF SAN LUIS OBISPO AND CITY OF PISMO BEACH CY2023 PERMANENT LOCAL HOUSING ALLOCATION AS REQUIRED BY THE CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

#### **ACTION REQUIRED:**

Vote to recommend amending the Permanent Local Housing Allocation for both the County of San Luis Obispo and City of Pismo Beach CY2023 allocations as required by the California Department of Housing and Community Development.

#### **SUMMARY NARRATIVE:**

Permanent Local Housing Allocation (PLHA) is a state program administered by the California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) which provides funding to local governments in California for housing-related projects and programs that assist in addressing the unmet housing needs of their local communities. Funding for PLHA is provided from moneys collected and deposited into the state's Building Homes and Jobs Trust Fund. To receive funding, local governments must prepare plans and submit plans to HCD showing how the funding will be used over a five-year period in compliance with PLHA requirements. Funding is appropriated annually to local governments with approved plans.

#### **County of San Luis Obispo PLHA Plan**

The County of San Luis Obispo is the lead agency in the development of the PLHA Plan, which includes the San Luis Obispo Urban County Entitlement Area (comprised of the unincorporated areas and the cities of Arroyo Grande, Atascadero, Morro Bay, Paso Robles, and San Luis Obispo). The cities of Pismo Beach and Grover Beach received separate PLHA allocations.

On July 14, 2020, the San Luis Obispo County Board of Supervisors approved the 5-year PLHA Plan and application to the State, defining how these funds are allocated by activity. Per the County's 5-year plan; 10% is allocated to affordable rental and ownership housing, 50% is allocated to matching funds in the San Luis Obispo County Housing Trust Fund, 35% is allocated to services that assist persons experiencing or at-risk of homelessness, and 5% is allocated to the County for administration of the grant program.

## **Program Changes This Year**

HCD released the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for CY2023 (Year five of the PLHA Plan) on October 15, 2024. The NOFA included updated requirements for setting aside funding for Affordable Ownership Worker Housing (AOWH).

Pursuant to the original PLHA authorizing statute, California Health and Safety Code Section 50470(b)(2)(A), twenty percent (20%) of the moneys collected and deposited in the Building Homes and Jobs Trust Fund must be expended for Affordable Owner-Occupied Workforce Housing (AOWH). The statute did not require PLHA grantees to allocate a percentage of their PLHA plans to AOWH, however HCD has an obligation to ensure that the 20% threshold for AOWH is met.

HCD monitors compliance with this requirement by reviewing allocations adopted in required 5-year plans and any amendments to those plans, as well as reviewing actual documented expenditures. Based on these indicators, HCD has determined that at the end of the current 5-year period applicable to CY 2019- 2023 allocations, funds projected to be expended on AOWH are trailing behind the required 20 percent.

To ensure that the statutory requirement for AOWH funding is met, the CY2023 PLHA NOFA will require all First-time applicants as well as previous grantees to amend their plans to include a 40% allocation to AOWH for any remaining allocations that have not yet been awarded.

The County's CY2023 allocation is \$573,308. Table 1 shows what the distribution of those funds would have looked like under the previously approved PLHA plan.

Staff consulted with the San Luis Obispo County Housing Trust Fund which is supportive of the proposed allocation changes.

The County released a Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for the estimated CY2023 allocation on September 3, 2024, based on the current allocation percentages. Applications received for homeless services projects will be recommended for funding based on the proposed allocation change of 27.5%. There were no project applications submitted for AOWH, therefore a separate Request for Proposals will be released in early 2025 for AOWH projects.

## **City of Pismo Beach Allocation**

On October 18, 2022, the County of San Luis Obispo Board of Supervisors approved the submittal of the PLHA application on behalf of the City of Pismo Beach. On November 4, 2022, the City of Pismo Beach and the County entered into an agreement to delegate the County to administer the City's PLHA allocation.

The City of Pismo Beach's PLHA Plan was originally modeled after the County's PLHA plan that was approved by the Board of Supervisors on July 14, 2020. On May 21, 2024, the Board of Supervisors approved an amendment to the City of Pismo Beach's PLHA Plan which changed the allocations for CY2020, CY2021, CY2022 (year's two-to-four of the five-year plan) to 95% allocated to services that assist persons experiencing or at-risk of homelessness, and 5% allocated to the County for administration of the grant program.

The City of Pismo Beach CY2023 allocation is \$69,268. Table 3 shows what the distribution of those funds would have looked like under the previously approved PLHA plan.

Staff consulted with City of Pismo Beach staff to inform them of the HCD requirements and to review the proposed allocation changes. As the City delegated authority to the County for administration of the program, no action is required by the City. A Request for Proposals will be released in early 2025 to solicit project applications for CY2023 City of Pismo Beach Allocation.

Approval of this item by HSOC would provide direction to staff to seek approval of a resolution by the County Board of Supervisors to amend both the County of San Luis Obispo's and City of Pismo Beach's CY2023 allocation that is required by HCD for submittal of the CY2023 PLHA applications.

Once approved by HCD, the County would receive \$642,576 in combined PLHA funding for the development of affordable ownership housing, matching funds to the San Luis Obispo County Housing Trust Fund, providing services to assist persons experiencing or at-risk of homelessness, and administration of the grant program.

## **STAFF COMMENTS**

If this item is approved by the HSOC, staff will bring an item on the consent agenda of the County Board of Supervisors on December 17, 2024, for approval of a resolution to amend both the County of San Luis Obispo and City of Pismo Beach's CY2023 PLHA allocation as required by HCD.

# McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act

Both HUD and the U.S. Department of Education (ED) base their services and eligibility on the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act, but each agency has their own definition of homeless.

ED ensures the *educational rights and protections* of children and youth experiencing homelessness.



## McK-V Definition for Education

Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence

- Fixed stationary, permanent, and not subject to change.
- Regular used on a normal, standard, and consistent basis.
- Adequate sufficient for meeting both the physical and psychological needs typically met in home environments.







## **Educational Rights**

## Educational rights include the right to:

- Remain in the School of Origin
- Immediate Enrollment in their district of residence
  - Without delay, regardless of the family's inability to produce required documentation, including immunization records



## Referral to Services

The liaison must ensure that homeless families and homeless children and youth receive referrals to:

- health care services,
- dental services,
- mental health & substance abuse services,
- housing services,
- and other appropriate services.
