20 The District Attorney of San Luis Obispo County, California, hereby accuses the
21 above named defendant of the following criminal offenses:

22 Count 1

23 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
24 crime of Forcible Rape in violation of PC261(a)(2), a Felony, was committed in that
25 BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did unlawfully have and accomplish an act of sexual
26 intercourse with a person, to wit, Confidential Victim, against said person's will, by means
27 of force, violence, duress, menace and fear of immediate and unlawful bodily injury on said
28 person and another.

1 NOTICE: Conviction of this offense will require the court to order you to submit to a blood
2 test for evidence of antibodies to the probable causative agent of Acquired Immune
3 Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS). Penal Code Section 1202.1.

4 NOTICE is hereby given that adjudication as a ward of the Court for this offense and a
5 disposition to the California Youth Authority will require you to register pursuant to Section
6 290 of the Penal Code. Willful failure to register is a felony.

7 NOTICE: Conviction of this offense will require you to register pursuant to Penal Code
8 section 290. Willful failure to register is a crime.

9 NOTICE: Adjudication as a ward of the court for this offense and a disposition to the
10 California Youth Authority will require you to provide specimens and samples pursuant to
11 Penal Code section 296. Willful refusal to provide the specimens and samples is a crime.

12 NOTICE: The above offense is a serious felony within the meaning of Penal Code Section
13 1192.7(c) and a violent felony within the meaning of Penal Code Section 667.5(c)

14 NOTICE: Penal Code 1203.065(a) prohibits the grant of probation or suspension of
15 imposition of sentence for this offense.

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18 Count 2

19 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
20 crime of Forcible Oral Copulation in violation of PC287(c)(2)(A), a Felony, was committed
21 in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did unlawfully participate in an act of oral
22 copulation with Confidential Victim and did accomplish said act against said victim's will by
23 force, violence, duress, menace, and fear of immediate and unlawful bodily injury to said
24 victim and to another.

25 NOTICE: Conviction of this offense will require the court to order you to submit to a blood
26 test for evidence of antibodies to the probable causative agent of Acquired Immune
27 Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS). Penal Code Section 1202.1.

1 NOTICE: Conviction of this offense will require you to register pursuant to Penal Code
2 section 290. Willful failure to register is a crime. NOTICE: The above offense is a serious
3 felony within the meaning of Penal Code Section 1192.7(c) and a violent felony within the
4 meaning of Penal Code Section 667.5(c)

5 Count 3

6 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
7 crime of Criminal Threats in violation of PC422, a Misdemeanor, was committed in that
8 BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did willfully and unlawfully threaten to commit a
9 crime which would result in death and great bodily injury to Confidential Victim, with the
10 specific intent that the statement be taken as a threat. It is further alleged that the
11 threatened crime, on its face and under the circumstances in which it was made, was so
12 unequivocal, unconditional, immediate and specific as to convey to Confidential Victim a
13 gravity of purpose and an immediate prospect of execution. It is further alleged that the
14 said Confidential Victim was reasonably in sustained fear of his/her safety and the safety
15 of his/her immediate family.

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17 Count 4

18 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
19 crime of Dissuading A Witness From Reporting A Crime in violation of PC136.1(b)(1), a
20 Misdemeanor, was committed in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did unlawfully
21 attempt to prevent and dissuade Confidential Victim, a victim and witness of a crime from
22 making a report of such victimization to a peace officer, state and local law enforcement
23 officer, probation, parole, and correctional officer, prosecuting agency, and judge.

24 Count 5

25 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
26 crime of Corporal Injury To Spouse/Cohabitant/Child's Parent in violation of PC273.5(a), a
27 Felony, was committed in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did willfully and
28

1 unlawfully inflict corporal injury resulting in a traumatic condition upon Confidential Victim,
2 who was the spouse of defendant.

3 Count 6

4 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
5 crime of Assault By Means Likely To Produce Great Bodily Injury in violation of
6 PC245(a)(4), a Felony, was committed in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did
7 willfully and unlawfully commit an assault on Confidential Victim by means of force likely to
8 produce great bodily injury.

9 Count 7

10 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
11 crime of Resisting Executive Officer in violation of PC69, a Misdemeanor, was committed
12 in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did unlawfully attempt by means of threats
13 and violence to deter and prevent Chelsea Stevenson, who was then and there an
14 executive officer, from performing a duty imposed upon such officer by law, and did
15 knowingly resist by the use of force and violence said executive officer in the performance
16 of her duty.

17 Count 8

18 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
19 crime of Resisting Executive Officer in violation of PC69, a Misdemeanor, was committed
20 in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did unlawfully attempt by means of threats
21 and violence to deter and prevent Kyle Alford Sternjacob, who was then and there an
22 executive officer, from performing a duty imposed upon such officer by law, and did
23 knowingly resist by the use of force and violence said executive officer in the performance
24 of his duty.

25 Count 9

26 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
27 crime of Resisting Executive Officer in violation of PC69, a Misdemeanor, was committed
28 in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did unlawfully attempt by means of threats

1 and violence to deter and prevent Justin Ughoc, who was then and there an executive
2 officer, from performing a duty imposed upon such officer by law, and did knowingly resist
3 by the use of force and violence said executive officer in the performance of his duty.

4 Count 10

5 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
6 crime of Resisting Executive Officer in violation of PC69, a Misdemeanor, was committed
7 in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did unlawfully attempt by means of threats
8 and violence to deter and prevent John Nichols, who was then and there an executive
9 officer, from performing a duty imposed upon such officer by law, and did knowingly resist
10 by the use of force and violence said executive officer in the performance of his duty.

11 Count 11

12 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
13 crime of Resist, Obstruct, Delay Of Peace Officer Or EMT in violation of PC148(a)(1), a
14 Misdemeanor, was committed in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did willfully and
15 unlawfully resist, delay and obstruct David Culver who was then and there a peace officer
16 attempting to and discharging the duty of his/her office and employment.

17 Count 12

18 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
19 crime of Assault On A Police Animal in violation of PC600(a), a Misdemeanor, was
20 committed in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did willfully, maliciously and with
21 no legal justification violate this section with regard to a police animal.

22 Count 13

23 On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the
24 crime of Unlawful Firearm Activity in violation of PC29825(b), a Misdemeanor, was
25 committed in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did own and posses a firearm
26 knowing that he was prohibited from doing so by a temporary restraining order, by an
27 injunction and by a protective order described in this subsection.

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Count 14

On or about March 6, 2020, in the County of San Luis Obispo, State of California, the crime of Contempt Of Court in violation of PC166(c)(1), a Misdemeanor, was committed in that BRYCE FREDERICK LITTLEJOHNS did willfully and knowingly violate a protective order and stay away order issued pursuant to Penal Code section 136.2.

The People hereby give notice of the People's intent to admit evidence of prior acts of domestic violence pursuant to Evidence Code section 1109. These incidents include the prior incident(s) described in the police report, chronological report, and/or tapes already provided, and other alleged incidents of abuse, which will be provided as they are obtained by the prosecution.

The People hereby notify defendant and defense counsel that the People intend to proceed under the provisions of Evidence Code section 1370 should the victim become unavailable at the time of trial.

It is further alleged pursuant to Penal Code Section 1170(b)(2) that one or more of the following factors in aggravation listed in California Rule of Court 4.421 may apply to the defendant(s) or to conduct of the defendant(s):

4.421(a)(1) The crime involved great violence, great bodily harm, threat of great bodily harm, and other acts disclosing a high degree of cruelty, viciousness and callousness.

4.421(a)(2) The defendant was armed with or used a weapon at the time of the commission of the crime.

4.421(a)(3) The victim was particularly vulnerable.

4.421(a)(4) The defendant induced others to participate in the commission of the crime and occupied a position of leadership and dominance of other participants in its commission.

1 4.421(a)(5) The defendant induced a minor to commit and assist in the commission of the
2 crime.

3 4.421(a)(6) The defendant threatened witnesses, unlawfully prevented and dissuaded
4 witnesses from testifying, suborned perjury, and in any other way illegally interfered with
5 the judicial process.

6 4.421(a)(7) The defendant is charged with other crimes for which consecutive sentences
7 can be imposed but for which concurrent sentences shall be imposed.

8 4.421(a)(8) The manner in which the crime was carried out indicates planning,
9 sophistication, and professionalism.

10 4.421(a)(9) The crime involved an attempted or actual taking or damage of great monetary
11 value.

12 4.421(a)(10) The crime involved a large quantity of contraband.

13 4.421(a)(11) The defendant took advantage of a position of trust and confidence to commit
14 the offense.

15 4.421(a)(12) The crime constitutes a hate crime under section 422.55 of the Penal Code
16 and no hate crime enhancements under section 422.75 of the Penal Code shall be
17 imposed and the crime is not subject to sentencing under section 1170.8 of the Penal
18 Code.

19 4.421(b)(1) The defendant has engaged in violent conduct that indicates a serious danger
20 to society.

21 4.421(b)(2) The defendant's prior convictions as an adult and sustained petitions in
22 juvenile delinquency proceedings are numerous and of increasing seriousness.

23 4.421(b)(3) The defendant has served a prior term in prison and county jail under section
24 1170(h).

25 4.421(b)(4) The defendant was on probation, mandatory supervision, post release
26 community supervision, and parole when the crime was committed.


27 4.421(b)(5) The defendant's prior performance on probation, mandatory supervision, post
28 release community supervision, and parole was unsatisfactory.

1 Contrary to the form, force and effect of that statute in such cases made and
2 provided and against the peace and dignity of the people of the State of California.
